FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends of FOMAR,

It is a pleasure to note that 2024 marks our 10th anniversary. Friends of Megan Animal Rescue has been rescuing animals and providing care and services to animals in need in Oaxaca for a decade! Just last year, we rescued 48 pups and some other animals in addition.

This past year, we rescued a badly injured burro, whom we named Milagro (“miracle”), whom we will continue to support. I say we, but it is primarily Rebecca, whose letter appears below, who does all the hands-on work. She is in Oaxaca year-round, while we only visit. She is the one who conducts the numerous clinics, with the help of Board Member Melinda Hanson, also in Oaxaca, at nearby municipalities. Last year she held three such clinics for vaccinating and sterilizing over 140 area dogs and cats. She is hoping, over the course of this year, to shift her emphasis even more to these clinics and various other outreach efforts.

This year we are also welcoming several new board members with the retirement of David and Linda Boyd, two of our original founders. It will take two persons to replace all of the work Linda has done — those two will be Sherie Hohs and Carey Allen, both of whom live in Oaxaca (at least a good portion of the year). David’s monumental work in tracking expenses, rescues, sterilizations, etc. will be taken over by Amie Durden. We are so grateful for the past work done as well as for the enthusiasm of our new volunteers.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

There was a slight decrease in the customary expenses (food, vet, misc.) for FOMAR in 2024, but the addition of the new expense for rescuing the caring for Milagro increased overall expenses. The expense for Milagro will be ongoing, as FOMAR has taken on the cost of her monthly boarding and care. There were slightly fewer donors in 2024, but the overall amount of donations increased. An effort will be made to increase the donor base.

At the end of 2024, FOMAR had a total of \$9,221.77 in assets (checking and savings accounts combined). FOMAR received \$18,371 from 68 individual donations. Six of those are recurring monthly donations. A July fundraiser in Oaxaca raised approximately \$1,500.

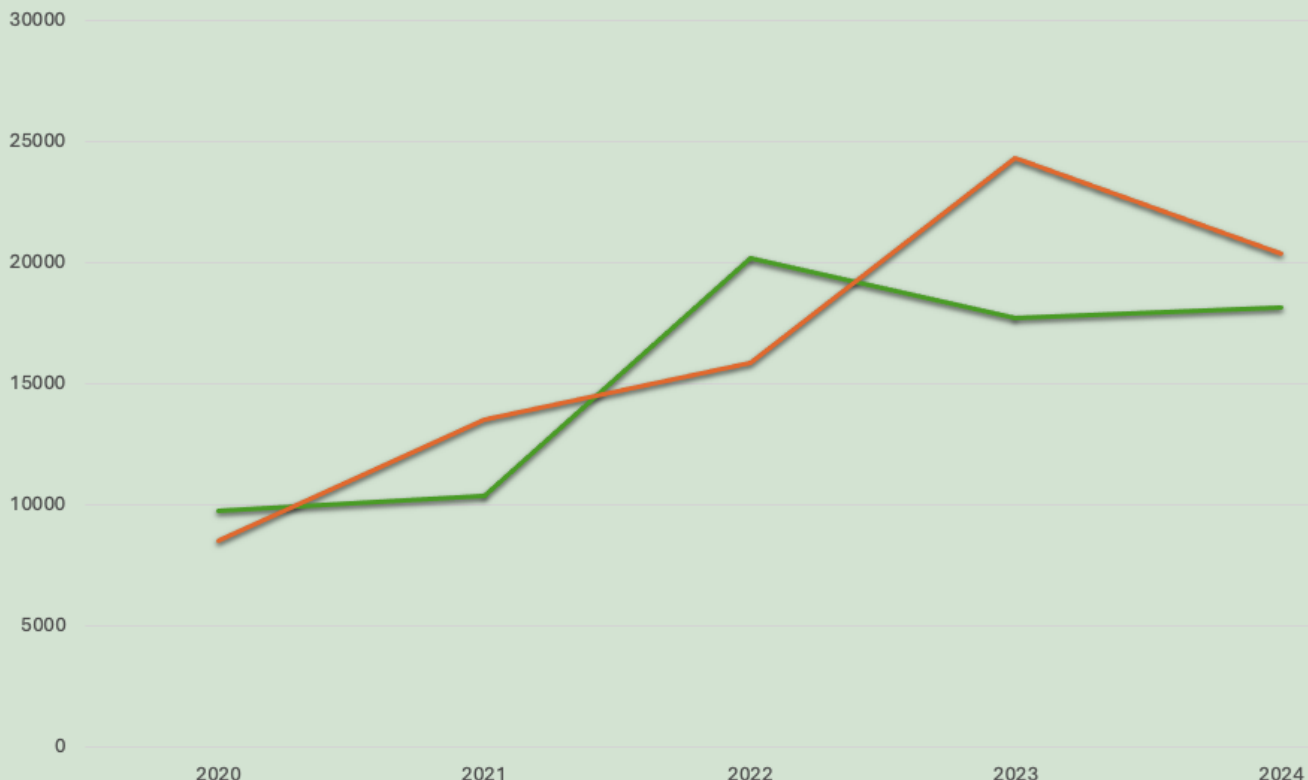
Overall, FOMAR has brought in \$113,722.72 since its founding in 2014, all of it used for rescuing more than 670 pets, and sterilizing and vaccinating at least 1,168 cats and dogs.

For a decade now, our 40+ acre property just outside Oaxaca City provides a safe haven for rescued dogs, cats, horses, burros, and birds.
